Celebration of Life Services At Trinity

A celebration of life service is a sacred occasion. Church of the Trinity's ministerial and lay staff wants to minister to your family and friends during this difficult time.

Our staff will help you plan a service that will honor God as well as the person whose life is being celebrated.

The purpose of a Celebration of Life/Funeral/Memorial service is to:

- To give thanks to God and affirm our belief in eternal life.
- To celebrate the life of the deceased.
- To assist family and friends in the mourning process.
- To draw on our spiritual resources as a community of faith in times of death, grief, and loss.

Following the death of a loved one, dealing with loss and the many decisions that must be made can feel overwhelming. We encourage you to give yourself time and space to make these decisions, including the planning of a memorial service.

We encourage you to read this information over, jot down any questions you may have, and bring your questions and the completed information sheet to the church a day prior to your arranged appointment with the pastor.

It is important to remember that celebration of life/ memorial services are for the living. In our experience working with grieving families, a memorial service truly helps in long process of healing.

At Trinity "celebration of life "services are informal occasions for family, friends, colleagues, and loved ones, to come together. The centerpiece of the service focuses on stories and reflections offered by loved ones.

We encourage you to involve family and friends in the service. For example, you may have a family member skilled in technology that can put together a short video or powerpoint on your loved ones life. You may have a family member gifted in music or reading scripture. These details personalize the service and will help the surviving loves ones in their individual grieving process.

A meeting will be arranged between you and a member of the pastoral staff to help plan the service. Prior to the meeting, please review this packet and complete the attached forms.

Planning the Service

Setting a Date and Time

We encourage family members to take time to grieve, and allow adequate time for decisions. In other words a memorial service need not be held right away. This will also give family members time to make travel arrangement.

Once you have met with a pastor, the facilities and events calendar will be reviewed for availability.

We typically schedule memorial services on Friday or Saturday. Due to Sunday services, we typically do not schedule memorial/services on Sundays. Scheduling is contingent upon the church calendar and the availability of sound technicians and music personnel. Please make note of your preferred date and time when you meet with the pastor.

Memorial Bulletin

Our office can assist with the drafting and printing of the memorial service bulletin. Typically we include a picture of your loved one on the front of the bulletin. If you can e-mail a high quality picture in a .jpeg format, this is most helpful. Alternatively we can order pre-printed memorial service bulletins with a scripture verse.

In addition to the order of service, the program may include an obituary, favorite writings, and/or a poem.

Readings & Music

For a memorial service, we suggest at least one scripture reading and as many as three, or you may substitute with a favorite poem or inspirational writing. A list of potential scripture readings are provided on page five.

You may consider several options for music during the service. For a simpler service, you may choose either to have no music or to provide pre-recorded music to our sound technicians to be played at designated times during the service, for example at the beginning and end. If you prefer to include an instrumentalist(s) or vocalist(s), an honorarium to the musician(s) will be required. A list of potential songs is provided in this packet, or you may have other original ideas or a favorite of the deceased.

Audio/Visual

If the service requires technology (powerpoint, video, sound tracks) Trinity will arrange for a sound/media technician to be available. A trained Trinity volunteer is required to be present in the sound booth. A small honorarium will be required for the sound tech if media needs are requested. The church has a projection screen with the capability of showing a slide presentation of photos from a CD or flash drive on Power Point software. If you need assistance, our Media Coordinator can be consulted. Fees should be paid directly to the technician for his/her services. You may also wish to display photos and memorabilia in the church lobby and/or in the front of the sanctuary.

Ushers and Attendees

Ushers should be available to help direct individuals or assist with special needs. You may either designate friends of the family, or church volunteers can provide this service. You may also wish to provide a sign-in register book at the door for a record of attendees. Sometimes a funeral home may provide a registration book. You can purchase one at a Christian book store or card shop. Decorative spiral bound notebooks also work well. Alternatively the church office can order a memorial guest book for \$25.

Ways to Remember

We encourage the publication of an obituary in the local paper of your choice indicating the date and time of the memorial service. If you have a picture of your loved one and can provide it to the church office we will send the obituary and memorial service information to our church membership lists.

Friends of the deceased often wish to either send flowers or give a monetary gift. You may wish to designate a charity, Church of the Trinity, or special fund to be so indicated in the obituary and program.

If you would like for your loved one to be remembered on the memorial wall at Church of the Trinity, our staff can order a memorial plaque.

In addition church courtyard pavers can be purchased in memory of your loved one. Church of the Trinity is in the initial stages of planning a columbarium garden for cremains. Currently we are not permitted to accept cremains. If you are interested in the columbarium, we will contact you when plans are confirmed.

Reception

A reception is not required; however, it is a good way for people to congregate and talk afterwards and offer their condolences. If you would like a reception at the church following the service, Pierce Hall can accommodate approximately 50 people. Weather permitting, there are also picnic tables outside on the grounds, and additional tables can be set up outside if needed.

If the reception is held at Church of the Trinity, we recommend ordering simple deli trays or contacting a catering firm to accommodate the reception.
